

CHAIR'S MESSAGE

On behalf of the board of Life Ed NSW/ACT it is my great privilege to welcome you to the Annual Report for 2021.

As the world continues to grapple with the COVID-19 pandemic, 2021 has been; for most of us, a trying year of challenges and changes. Every Australian has been affected and for many, life has been brought to a complete standstill as we endure lockdowns and restrictions, once again.

The lives of children in NSW and ACT have been very much disrupted. After a year of remote schooling and social disconnection, paired with unparalleled economic pressures on family life, the priority for building student wellbeing and resilience has never been higher. The ability to spring back from adversity is a quality Life Ed programmes have aimed to instill into all children and young people, helping to equip them to handle the world's challenges and tests.

In pursuing our vision to empower the next generation of healthy young Australians, this pandemic year has forced us to meet it with creativity and innovation. The Life Ed NSW/ACT team immediately moved into emergency action as we could no longer help students and their families by face-to-face visits. Our response to the crisis would have to be through the new, expanded programme delivery methods. It was imperative we reach all students, no matter their circumstances or the distance.

Both schools and families were able to access the new Life Ed Online programme platform, giving health and wellbeing content directly and equitably to in-class and at-home learners. Not only are we making a difference to the lives of Aussie families, but we have also visited more than 248,000 students across NSW and ACT. We extended our reach to primary schools, secondary schools, and early learning centres through the rapid expansion of our Virtual Classroom programme, which live-streams our specialist educators via the internet to learners. Whether they are in classrooms, home or anywhere else.

Our board is so proud to see Life Ed continue to rise to meet the needs of the community and to see our programmes reaching as many people as possible. I would like to thank my board colleagues, our senior leadership, and passionate team of educators for their dedication and success in making a positive difference to the lives of so many students throughout a complex and everchanging series of challenges.

Our work is sustained by the support of governments, corporate and community partners, our staff, and our many dedicated volunteers. We thank you for your continued support which has ensured children have not missed out on learning the valuable life skills they need to acquire to thrive.

CEO'S MESSAGE

Thank you to the teachers, educators and child care specialists who went above and beyond to help families and children throughout school closures – our communities truly couldn't do it without you.

While the last 12 months have challenged us, this pandemic year has also presented unique opportunities allowing our organisation to reach more students through innovative delivery methods. Throughout this report you will see some of the great work that has been done by the team.

Some highlights have been:

- · Launch of the Life Education Online learning platform to families and schools allowing for continued learning for 55,000 students during lockdown.
- · Expansion of 5 virtual classrooms, livestreaming Healthy Harold's lessons with our specialist educators to over 12,500 primary school students and 4,600 pre-schoolers.
- · Upskilled our team by running peer to peer training sessions, wellbeing initiatives, developed new education content and re-designed lesson plans for greater impact.
- · Significantly improved our evaluation and feedback process (including student voice) to ensure we are delivering impact.
- · Scored 93/100 in the McKinsey Organisational Health Index, placing us in the top 10% of a global pool of organisations.

Importantly, we've supported each other as a team throughout this pandemic year, so we can continue to create impact and help raise the next generation of healthy young Australians. I am especially proud of the respect, integrity and tenacity our team has demonstrated at every turn.

On behalf of Life Ed NSW/ACT we thank you for your ongoing support for our organisation. We are proud to have empowered 248,000 students across NSW and ACT to develop the crucial skills needed to look after their physical, social and emotional wellbeing. 

OUR VIRTUAL CLASSROOM EXPANSION

The need for equitable access to Health and Wellbeing education for both in-class and athome learners grew exponentially throughout the NSW & ACT lockdown periods.

Live-streamed via Zoom from our studio directly into the classroom, or wherever learners were, our Virtual Classroom lessons provided a swift response to the increasing demand to be able to reach students no matter their circumstance.

12 unique and interactive modules were delivered virtually to primary schools, featuring our specialist health educators, and of course, Healthy Harold.

Life Ed now has three mobile learning centres and two static studios fitted with virtual classroom live-streaming functions.

While the disruption of face-to-face learning presented its challenges, it has also provided families with a unique opportunity to engage in their children's learning.

Thanks to funding received by the Westpac Foundation, Life Ed was able to launch Healthy Harold's online learning platform to all Australian families.

The learning came alive, as families enjoyed entertaining video content and interactive games with Healthy Harold, whilst learning skills and strategies on important topics such as cybersafety, positive relationships, nutrition, physical activity, and the impact of alcohol and other drugs.







The platform's suite of engaging Health and Wellbeing content acted as a catalyst for family engagement, prompting dinner table conversations around healthy lifestyles and behaviours.

The program's popularity sparked the interest of Channel 7 News, who showcased how Healthy Harold's new online initiative was supporting Australian families during the school holidays, and helping primary students, who missed crucial life

lessons during lockdown, catch up online.

In addition to families, over 260 schools subscribed to Life Ed Online during 2021. In total, we're proud to have supported over 55,000 online learners learn how to build healthy habits and make good decisions to lead safer lives.

In FY2020-21 we surveyed more than 7,300 students who participated in our drug and alcohol modules, to assess the effectiveness of our program in improving their health outcomes.

In FY2020-21, 865 teachers utilized our Teacher Assessment Tool and assesssed over 17,900 students engaging with the Life Education program.

Here's what teachers observed:








Healthy Harold goes LIVE


For Mental Health Month, NSW Department of Education presented 'Wellbeing Week' on their DART Learning platform. Healthy Harold joined an exciting line-up of events, from some of Australia's leading mental health and wellbeing providers.



Streamed via Youtube Live, Life Ed presented a highly engaging lesson which used Augmented Reality technology to spark the curiosity of students, and deepen their understanding of who they are and how to stay healthy. Over 20,000 students from 338 schools onboarded the futuristic journey with Healthy Harold, Kial & Michelle as they explored the inside of the human body and took everyone along for the ride.

New program to tackle online predatory behaviour risk for children

Thanks to the support of Westpac's Safer Children, Safer Communities program, Life Ed introduced new content into our popular school-based cyber safety program, bCyberwise, so kids can play active part in staying safe online. The new updates mean primary school children aged 8-10 will soon be armed with the tools to recognise, react and report online predatory behaviour and inappropriate content.









Sun rises on Life Ed at Mulgoa Public School

Channel 7 Sunrise shone a bright light on the work of Healthy Harold in helping to build stronger Aussie kids. Showcasing our 10-year partnership with Mulgoa Public School, James Tobin and the Channel 7 crew explored Life Ed's latest initiatives, including our Outdoor Pop-up Classroom, TAM-e technology, our well-known Mobile Learning Centres, and of course, an appearance from Healthy Harold.

Healthy Harold joins forces with R U OK?



Half of all the mental health conditions we experience at some point in our lives will have started by age 14. As a community,

it's important to get in front of this and empower children to meaningfully connect with those around them.

R U OK? Day is the national day of action dedicated to encouraging everyone to start a conversation with those in their world who may be struggling with life.

To contribute, Healthy Harold collaborated with R U OK? to present a video lesson suitable for primary school children of all ages, teaching students how to check in with each other and themselves.













ARE OUR STRENGTH

We can only pursue our vision of empowering generations of healthy young Australians living to their full potential, through the passion, commitment and knowledge demonstrated by our staff.

While Healthy Harold often steals the limelight at Life Ed, the real stars of the show are our vibrant team of over 50 specialist health educators. Every day they bring life and meaning to our Health and Wellbeing program, ensuring our youngest members of society don't get left behind.

Throughout the state lockdown periods, Life Ed was able to secure employment for all staff, offering a range of flexible options to balance work and personal needs.

To enhance wellbeing during lockdown, our team stayed connected via regular Teams catch-ups, participating in project work and teaching virtually.

Additionally, Life Ed launched Virtual Peer-to-Peer reviews and assessments, where educators have been able to mock classroom sessions via Microsoft Teams in order to provide feedback to each other and further develop teaching practices. It was a wonderful way to share learnings, as well as a way to stay connected virtually.

ORGANISATIONAL **HEALTH INDEX**

Life Ed undertook an Organisational Health Index (OHI) analysis via our probono partnership with McKinsey & Company.

Life Ed came top of the class, with an overall health score of 93/100, which places us in the top 10% of organisations across all sectors. We also ranked high scores in all nine key outcomes (right)

VIRTUAL STAFF TRAINING

An exciting innovation has been the successful onboarding of new educator recruits via initial Virtual Training. Our Educator Management Team have utilised Microsoft Teams to prepare and train new recruits despite their distance, which has potentially reduced the time it takes for an educator to be ready to teach independently by 3-4 weeks.

Many of our MP Ambassadors are also graduates of the Life Ed program, including the Hon. Sarah Mitchell MLC.




